Election day was November 7th. In Gregg County there are 72,999 registered voters. Only 11,488 (15.74%) voted on these important amendments

All but 1 passed in Gregg County here's the stats:

1. Passed 89%-11%
2. Passed 68%-32%
3. Passed 80%-20%
4. Passed 88%-12%
5. Passed 64%-36%
6. Passed 80%-20%
7. Passed 74%-26%
8. Passed 73%-28%
9. Passed 84%-16%
10. Passed 64%-26%
11. Passed 61%-39%
12. Passed 63%-37%
13. Failed 44%-56%
14. Passed 76%-24%

SB7 was passed in the 3rd special session and signed by Gov. Abbott on November 10, 2023, at the Governor's Mansion. Grassroots activist, Jackie Schlegel's organization, *Texans for Medical Freedom* was the driving force behind this bill. If you remember, Jackie was our Guest speaker several months ago. Her mission is to ban Vaccine mandates. This bill was written and carried by State Rep. Jeff Leach in the house and Senator Mayes Middleton in the Senate. SB7 bans Covid-19 vaccine mandates for any Texas Employee-including medical and nursing students.

A Historic 4th special session was called on November 8, 2023

The Governor is adamant about getting the School Choice and Education Savings Accounts done. HB1 was the bill to follow. House reconvened on Friday 11/17 at 10am.

An amendment to an amendment was introduced by Rep. John Raney to strip Education savings accounts from the bill. The amendment passed because 21 Republican Reps joined all the Democrats and it was stripped from HB1, then the bill was sent back to committee and it most likely will not get another hearing, which will kill the bill. 3 of the 21 Republicans joining the Democrats are from East Texas. They are Travis Clardy HD11, Gary VanDeaver HD1 and Jay Dean HD7. One interesting fact is that all the Freshman House Rep voted in favor of School Choice, so the future is bright to empowering parents and freeing our kids from failing public schools. We will have to wait to see if Gov. Abbott calls for another special session

Other strong conservative bills that passed are:

SB3 by Senator Joan Huffman with house sponsor Jacey Jetton:

This bill appropriates 1.5 billion to continue building the border wall. These funds are in addition to the over 5 billion appropriated to continue funding operation Lone Star. The bill increases DPS overtime pay.

SB4 By Senator Charles Perry with House sponsor Rep. David Spiller, was passed in the Texas house on 11/14/23. This bill authorizes law enforcement to send migrants back to a border point of entry in lieu of arresting and jailing them, which would save taxpayers from footing the bill for housing, food and healthcare and deter illegal entry in the future.

It also creates a state crime to enter or attempt to enter the state illegally from Mexico, with a higher penalty imposed on individuals with a previous conviction of the same crime.

It creates a 2nd degree felony for an individual who refuses to comply with an order to return to where they came from. These Bills are the **strongest stand** that any state has taken to protect its citizens and sovereignty.


This bill will head to Gov. Abbott to sign.

What can **YOU** do:


1. Become a Volunteer Deputy Registrar and sign people up to vote
