Legislative Chair Update

Federal news:

President Trump has been back in office for one month and to date, has closed the southern border, signed 73 Executive Orders, confirmed 19 new cabinet members, ended DEI in the federal government, ended the participation of men in women's sports in federally funded programs, launched MAHA to Make America Healthy Again, launched DOGE to cut wasteful spending, ended the weaponization of the federal government, ended federal censorship of free speech, and restored the death penalty at the DOJ. He has re-established the truth of only 2 sexes, brought home numerous hostages from around the world, is working on the ending the Russia-Ukraine war, and working on peace in the Middle East (to name just a few). The US House and Senate are working to pass a new budget that will implement President Trump's agenda and then will begin to codify as many of Trump's executive orders as possible. Both houses are working on passing the Family and Small Business Taxpayer Protection Act, legislation co-sponsored by Rep. Nathaniel Moran (in the House). If passed, the Act will freeze the remainder of the \$80 billion dollars the Biden-Harris administration earmarked for new IRS workers to audit hardworking Americans and will instead direct the money toward safeguarding taxpayer data.

Texas House:

Governor Abbott set forth his emergency priorities agenda earlier this month in his State of the State Address. His legislative priorities for this term include school choice, raising teacher pay, important water projects, and property tax relief. The House and Senate are working on these priorities. A school voucher program, passed by the Senate earlier this year, was sent to the House last week. State Water Plan legislation, co-sponsored by Jay Dean, is also working its way toward passage. Please let Sen. Bryan Hughes and Rep. Dean know how you feel about these issues. They need to know how you want them to vote! Speaker Dustin Burrows enacted new rules to govern House legislative action. He appointed Republicans to Chair all of the committees; however, he also created Democrat Vice-Chairs for each committee. He also created 12 new permanent subcommittees, half of which are to be headed by Democrats.

Due: April 15, 2025

Amount: \$1000

Eligibility:

- 2025 Female High School Graduating Senior in Gregg County
- U.S. Citizen or legal resident
- Affirm personal and political values align with the Republican Platform
- Will be a registered voter age 18 by August 2025 with plans to act on your patriotic duty to vote
- Minimum High School GPA equivalent to a "B" and provide transcripts
- Three (3) character letters of recommendation (school, community, or church)
- Author a 300-word essay on your educational goals and future career plans
- Proof of acceptance to a 2-year or 4-year college or accredited trade school
- To receive funds, the recipient must present proof of admittance to a 2- or 4-year college or trade school
- Affirm availability to accept the scholarship July 16, 2025, at The Jalapeno Tree in Longview at 12:00 noon, if selected
- Provide written permission to allow your photo to be taken and provided to the Longview News-Journal and social media
- Essay must be the applicant's original thoughts and words and should reflect the level of composition and standard use of the English language generally expected of entering college freshman. Use paragraphs, correct spelling and punctuation, and concise sentences with a subject and predicate that agree.

Essay format requirements:

- Times New Romans 12 pt. font and double-spaced with 1-inch margins
- Not to exceed two 8.5" x 11" pages
- Must be at least 300 words, not counting the title (include word count at the end of your essay)
- Title your essay
- Quotes and/or references though not required must be cited using MLA format
- Do not include your name on the essay itself. It is strongly advised that another person review your work for corrections as noted above. Computer spell and grammar check will not catch all errors! All applicants receive fair and equal reviews. All decisions are final.

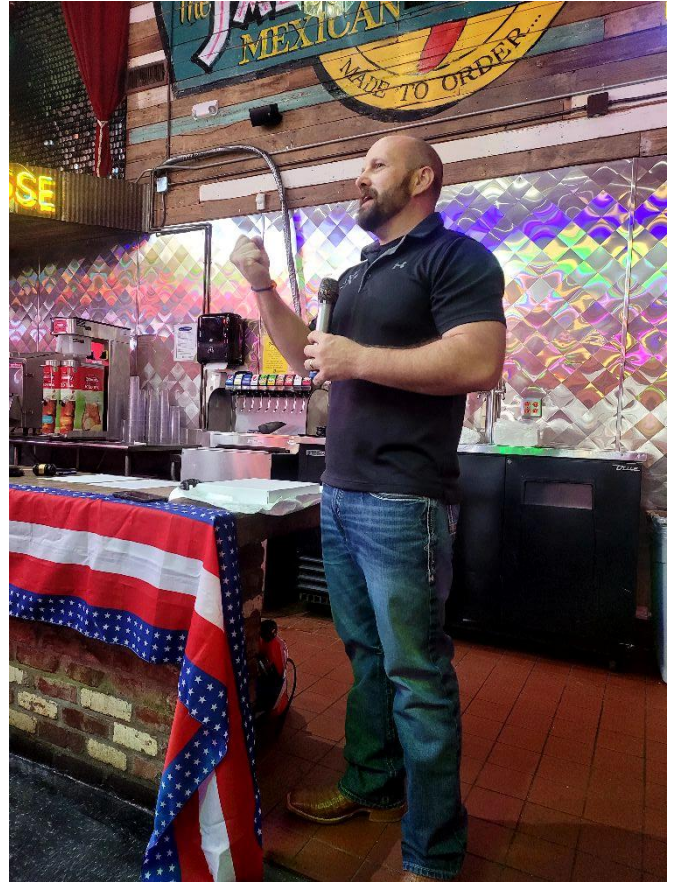
