Legislative Chair Update

**** **SEVERAL REALLY GOOD** election reform bills **NEVER** made it out of the House Calendar Committee. Every single member of the Calendar Committee was assigned by Speaker Burrows and were supporters of his bid for Speaker. Jay Dean and Cole Hefner supported Burrows.

The Texas Legislature ended its 2025 session on June 2. It passed 3,557 bills and resolutions. Governor Abbott has already signed close to 400 bills; June 22 was the deadline to sign or veto legislation. Several good bills were passed, but a few really good bills never made it out of the House. The following are just a few of the bills that are making their way into becoming law:

SB 2 – School vouchers for qualified impoverished and special needs children

SB 4 -- Cutting property taxes

SB 8 – Immigration bill requiring sheriffs' offices with jails to cooperate with DHS and ICE

SB 9 – No more bail for detained illegals subject to immigration detainers

SB 10 – The 10 Commandments Bill requiring public and charter schools to post copies of The Ten Commandments in classrooms but doesn't require the schools to purchase them

SB 11 – School prayer/Bible reading, which requires school boards to vote on prayer and Bible reading in public and charter schools.

SB 12 – DEI ban in K-12

SB 13 – Parents Bill of Rights, which entitles parents to all written records regarding their children in public schools, including records of all library materials the child obtains from school libraries, medical and mental health services acquired on school property, **EVERYTHING** concerning their child. Provides parental access to school library catalogs/materials and allows parents to provide to the school a list of books/materials their child may NOT access.

SB 17 –Texas is Not for Sale Bill, which prohibits certain governments, organizations, and individuals from designated foreign countries, including China, from acquiring real property in Texas and establishes a criminal offense for individuals and a civil penalty for companies or entities for violations.

SB 20 –Child Porn Bill – This bill criminalizes and penalizes obscene material depicting children under the age of 18 regardless of whether the images are of real children or AI-generated children.

SB 31 – Life of the Mother Act – This bill allows doctors to perform abortions to protect women whose physical lives are harmed by pregnancy, including tubal pregnancies or instances where the woman needs cancer treatment. BUT it also requires doctors to exercise reasonable care to save the baby when possible.

HB 4535 – Requires informed consent for the Covid vaccine.

SB 1—The State's \$337 billion spending budget for the next 2 years.

KAY BURTON, AMERICANS FOR PROSPERITY'S GRASSROOTS ENGAGEMENT DIRECTOR, GUEST SPEAKER AT JUNE 18TH MEETING

Our June meeting featured Kay Burton of Americans for Prosperity, who shared detailed information about government and school district spending trends in our community. The City of Longview and Longview Independent School District hold millions of dollars of debt, along with interest charges of more than half the principal. By contrast, Gregg County's debt is less than 10% of the City's. That information really got our attention!

Kay shared with the group that the Texas Legislature gave property owners \$18 billion in relief in 2023. That surprised many in the audience, since property taxes have not decreased. An additional \$10 billion in relief from this Legislative session has to be voted on by the taxpayers. This is one of the Constitutional Amendments we will vote on in November.

Kay encouraged those in attendance to be sure we are informed so we can question our local taxing entities and hold them accountable for the financial decisions that affect all taxpayers. She challenged the audience to get involved in demanding property tax reform in Texas. Timing is critical if citizens are to have a chance of affecting the way our tax dollars are spent – and returned to us, as promised.



Kay has extended an invitation to join her at The Jalapeno Tree on July 15th at 6:00 p.m. to hear from a panel of Americans for Prosperity tax policy experts. The discussion will include how to contest property tax rates, how to confront officials about overspending, where we are likely headed in property tax reform, and an evaluation of local spending. Americans for Prosperity will provide The Jalapeno Tree's famous fajita bar for guests. Mark your calendars, and invite a friend!

The FBI Internet Crime Complaint Center's 2024 Internet Crime Report reveals 859,532 complaints of suspected internet crime and details reported losses exceeding \$16 billion – a 33% increase in losses from 2023.

The most complaints were received from California, Florida, and Texas. People over the age of 60 suffered the most losses at nearly \$5 billion.
